



## <u>Billing Guide for Tobacco Screening Services</u> <u>Screening, Intervention, and Counseling for Small Practices</u>

Under the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) benefit, all children enrolled in Medicaid in the U.S. Virgin Islands are provided with comprehensive coverage for Tobacco services like screening patients for tobacco use and secondhand smoke exposure, encouraging patients and families to stop smoking, and provide cessation resources. This is only a sample of outpatient codes, which can be used for counseling patients or guardians. Billers should contact private insurance companies to find reimbursement rates for the following codes.

One way to obtain payment when the parent or guardian smokes, and is being counseled by the pediatrician is to report the **E/M service** (e.g., 99201-99215) using time as the key factor. Use as many diagnosis codes that apply to document the patient's complexity and report symptoms. This includes additional codes (not included here) for asthma, substance abuse, and mental health disorders etc. Use Z codes to report reason for encounter.

For a complete list of diagnoses names for tobacco-related encounters and associated CPT or ICD-10 codes, please refer to the table below. Please report all pertaining diagnoses to complete billing procedures. If the diagnosis of the treated patient is not in the list, please refer to an ICD-10 code finder on the web.
